

PROTECTING CONFIDENTIALITY WITH LGBTQ PEOPLE

DO:

 Clearly inform the LGBTQ person that you will keep information about their identity private unless they say otherwise. For example, you might say:



"I will keep this information confidential, until you say otherwise. Thank you for trusting me."

• Listen without judgment or a specific agenda, such as convincing the person to share with others before they are ready.

DO NOT:

 Tell family, friends, or anyone else about someone's LGBTQ identity unless they give you permission.



Ask questions out of curiosity.

Before asking a LGBTQ person a personal question, ask yourself: Is my question necessary for my job and/or role?

If the question is relevant to your job, ask yourself: How can I gather the information in a sensitive way?

CONFIDENTIALITY OF LGBTQ STUDENTS IN SCHOOLS
